Health

Projects under our Health Programme remove the barriers which keep children out of school, tackle issues which put their safety at risk and promote good health and well-being for all children to thrive.

What we do

Deliver healthcare services

The AfriKids Medical Centre (a primary hospital) provides essential healthcare in a region with only one doctor for every 35,010 people. By working with the National Health Insurance Scheme, it offers treatment for Malaria and other common conditions free of charge to enrolled patients, making these life-saving services available to even the poorest families. AfriKids health outreach includes basic health screenings for children at school and specialist clinics and support groups in the community for families living with disabilities and extra needs.

Improve the range and quality of healthcare services

AfriKids' strong relationships locally and around the world have bolstered healthcare skills, services and equipment in northern Ghana. The award-winning GAS Partnership for health (a collaboration between Ghana Health Service, AfriKids and University Hospital Southampton in the UK) is bringing global best practices in maternal and paediatric health, trauma response and safe surgery to Ghana, some the first of its kind in the country.

Educate children and communities on good health

Through AfriKids' extensive network and trusted local reputation, it is educating communities on how to keep children healthy at home and the importance of accessing essential health services such as family planning and antenatal care. Through education on the causes and effects of disability, including with inspiring spokespeople who have disabilities themselves, AfriKids is also tackling the stigma and fear of disabilities, ending harmful practices like the killing of "spirit children" and promoting the rights of all children.
